Targeted Search and Victim Removal (VEIS)

This all-day class is intended to be a primer on the application of VEIS, targeted search and victim removal from residential structure fires. The morning portion will consist of discussion and explanation of the determining factors and the decision-making processes leading to the use of targeted search. Also covered will be some basic ladder and access techniques, tool selection and victim positioning and removal from first and second floor locations. The afternoon session will provide opportunities for hand-on application of the discussed principles and techniques in a simulated fire environment. PPE requirements: Full structural firefighting PPE and SCBA. Class size is limited. Students must be comfortable operating in Structural PPE and SCBA prior to the class and be able to perform difficult physical tasks while “on air.”

Note: This is a one-day class offered on Saturday.

Basic-20 Firefighting Course

ATTENTION CHIEFS: If you have a new member in your department, this is the course for them! Experienced fire instructors will cover the basics of Admin, Safety, Fire Behavior, Extinguishers, Forcible Entry, Ventilation, Ropes, Fire Control, Appliances, Salvage & Overhaul, hose, ladders, SCBA, Drivers Training (POV) and PPE. The course will include “hands-on drills and the opportunity for students to Don protective equipment.

Note: This course is a 3-day course held Friday through Sunday limited to 30 students. Full PPE is required including SCBA and a spare Cylinder. Students must be 18 years of age. Classes will start at 6pm on Friday night.

Flashover Chamber- classroom lecture & Burn

FLASHOVER (Classroom lecture and Burn) Welcome to the Kentucky Fire Commission Flashover Recognition & Survival Course. This course was created and adopted to provide structural firefighters in Kentucky with a safe and secure system of Flashover training. This course meets the 8-hour requirement for all firefighters seeking the 400-hour certification level in Kentucky. The goal is to improve recognition and provide survival techniques to save firefighters from injury and death from rapid fire progression and related phenomena.

PREREQUISITES: Live Fire Course Competency Validation form (or similar verification). Any student with facial hair that impedes the seal of the face piece will not be allowed to participate in accordance with 29 CFR 1910.134 (OSHA). Protective gear will be inspected prior to entry into the trailer. **All gear must be within the 10-year from manufacture date. Required Equipment: In-date turnout gear and SCBA Live Fire Competency Validation Form**

Fire Blast -Prop

This class will utilize the Kentucky Fire Commission's new Fire blast Burn Trailer to provide the students with a variety of fireground situations. Included in the capabilities of the trailer will be firefighting a below grade fire, standpipe operations, pitched roof ventilation, second story firefighting, room and contents fire, search and rescue operations in a smoke-filled environment and other situations as time allows. Students enrolling in this class should come prepared to learn and work as a firefighting team. This class will benefit both new and experienced responders. This class will concentrate on hands-on "learning by doing" skills. **The Firefighter must bring PPE, a full SCBA and spare cylinder. PPE will have to be within the 10-year life span and in good shape.**

This class is limited to 25 students.

This class will be on Sunday only.

Modern Vehicle Extrication

The class will begin outside to practice extrication techniques on small to large vehicles and will have some technical scenarios to work through. This class will provide the students the opportunity to access, plan, and implement extrication strategies in a variety of passenger vehicles. **Full personal Protective equipment without SCBA is required. Prerequisite: Working knowledge of basic rescue tools.**

Confined Space Rescue

This all-day class is an introduction to the basic principles and application of Confined Space Rescue. OSHA's 29 CFR 1910.146 Standard on Confined Spaces will be covered in this training as well as techniques for proper entry into Permit Required Confined Spaces and procedures to follow when rescue from these spaces becomes necessary. **PPE requirements: Boots, long pants, leather gloves, safety glasses, helmet (technical rescue or structural firefighting certified type helmet).**

Note: This is a one-day class offered on Saturday and Sunday

Man-Vs-machine Traumatic Injury Extrication

Have you ever received a call for someone stuck in a HVAC vent, A wedding ring stuck on a finger, or a motorcycle accident Victim impaled on a signpost? The rescuer often finds difficulty in approaching these situations simply because of the unknown. Our instructors will provide “out of the box” ways of thinking that is usually not incorporated with normal fire service operations. This class will help students develop a framework of techniques and tools that will make this operation smooth and safe. At the end of this class the student will be confident in proper tool choice for these types of incidents and able to operate with confidence on scene. This class focuses on hands-on training using many different types of cutting tools to complete extrication scenarios. **Pre-Requisites: Safety Glasses, Helmet, turn out coat or Extrication gear and work gloves.**

Note: This is a two-day class offered on Sat & Sunday.

Firefighter survival & Rescue

The Kentucky Fire Commission mandates that ALL firefighters need to attend the Firefighter Survival & Rescue course to attain certification as a firefighter in KY. The Firefighter Survival course is the first segment of this training course and is intended to illustrate to the student the procedures to implement and follow to save oneself in the event of a catastrophic event on the fireground. The Firefighter Rescue is the second segment of this course and is intended to train the firefighter how to work to rescue someone else in the event of a bad situation on the fireground. Firefighter Survival will be offered on Saturday and Firefighter Rescue will be offered on Sunday. Junior firefighters are welcome in this class. **FULL PROTECTIVE CLOTHING & SCBA REQUIRED**

Note: This is a 2-day class offered on Saturday & Sunday. Classroom will be on Saturday and Skills on Sunday.

The class is limited to 25 students.

Hybrid Vehicles & Electric Cars

This class is designed to instruct First Responders how to identify and make safe; for extrication of occupants, the following vehicles at motor vehicle accidents: Hybrid Vehicles, Electric Vehicles (EV), Compressed Natural Gas Vehicles (CNG), and Liquid Natural Gas Vehicles (LNG). The First Responders will learn through power point presentation, visual examination of actual vehicles and use of the web to identify alternative fueled vehicles, determining their power and running status. Learn the proper procedure to disable the 12-volt electrical system when the 12-volt battery is not in a readily visible location. Identify proper procedures to safely "power down" and "make safe" hybrid vehicles/EV from the first hybrid vehicle/EV to hit the road to the most advanced hybrid/electric vehicles on the road today. Learn power down and fuel shut off procedures for compressed natural gas (CNG) and liquid natural gas (LNG) Over the Road Trucks and Transit Buses. Hands-on with various alternative fuel vehicles. Extrication implications of high strength steel alloys that are being used in vehicles today and how they will be used in the near future. Key locations of High Voltage components that are a concern for extrication.

EMT Refresher

This is the mandatory section of the U.S. DOT EMT-Basic Refresher as required for recertification as a National Registry EMT-Basic. This 24-hour course will also qualify as CEs for state recertification as an EMT-Basic. This course will provide you with the required hours needed to recertify for your current EMT license. This course will also include the 2-hour HIV/AIDS education requirement. Students should bring a CPR pocket mask, penlight, and stethoscope.

Note: This is a 3-day course held Friday through Sunday limited to 40 students. Class will begin on Friday night at 6pm.

NFA Incident Safety Officer

The safety officer oversees all tasks performed by firefighters on the fire grounds. Safety Officers are responsible for immediately correcting safety problems and creating an awareness of simple precautions that can save lives and prevent injury. The goal of this course is to provide firefighters with skills to function effectively as the safety officer at the fire department incident operations. The primary focus shall be on developing decision-making skills through the recognition of problems that affect personal safety. Target audience would be firefighters who may have the safety Officer responsibility in Emergency Operation situations.

Note: This is a 2-day course that will be held Saturday through Sunday

Fire Dept / Emergency Management Planning and Response to weather-Related Emergencies

Emergency responders today are faced with increased challenges to their successful completion of mission. Weather affects every first responder, and severe weather can be a real threat to the safety and wellbeing of responders and citizens alike. As we have recently witnessed in both December and July, Kentucky and the entire regions experiences a wide variety of weather phenomena which ultimately leads to responses from the local fire department and other public safety agencies. This course will include information about some of the more common weather phenomena experienced in Kentucky, how to pre-plan for it, ways to anticipate its arrival, and discuss ways to improve fire department response in its aftermath.

Active Shooter Preparedness-Integrated Initial Response

“Integrated Initial Response to School Violence Incidents” This course has been developed by the WKU Disaster Science Operations Center in partnership with the Barren River Area Development District, Kentucky Fire Recue Training, Kentucky Emergency Management, Warren County Sheriff’s Department and Western Kentucky University This class will include both classroom and demonstration/Hands on segments. Overall, this course will include: the characteristics of an active shooter/mass violence incident, incident command /unified command, initial response by law enforcement, Fire/EMS response, Rescue taskforce concepts, and pre-planning considerations. Students will discuss the elements of active shooter incidents, describe common behavior, conditions, and situations associated with these types of events.

Fire Scene Investigations

This is a comprehensive course with emphasis on techniques to determine the origin and cause of fires. Actual case scenarios will be incorporated to enhance this class. A wide variety of expertise is brought together through the cooperation of local, state, federal, fire, police, and private investigators to provide the student with excellent instruction and detail.

Note: Pre-Requisites include proof of completion of an acceptable Arson 1 course. You must have signed permission from your chief prior to attending fire investigation courses taught by the Kentucky Chapter of IAAI. Students will need Full Protective Turnout gear.

Basic Chaplaincy

This two-day class will cover basic information that will partially fulfill requirements necessary to be considered a certified chaplain by the State Fire Commission. Class will cover the basic duties of the chaplain such as “Line of Duty Death,” Death notifications, FD funerals, Benefits and more.

Note: This is a 2-day class offered on Saturday and Sunday

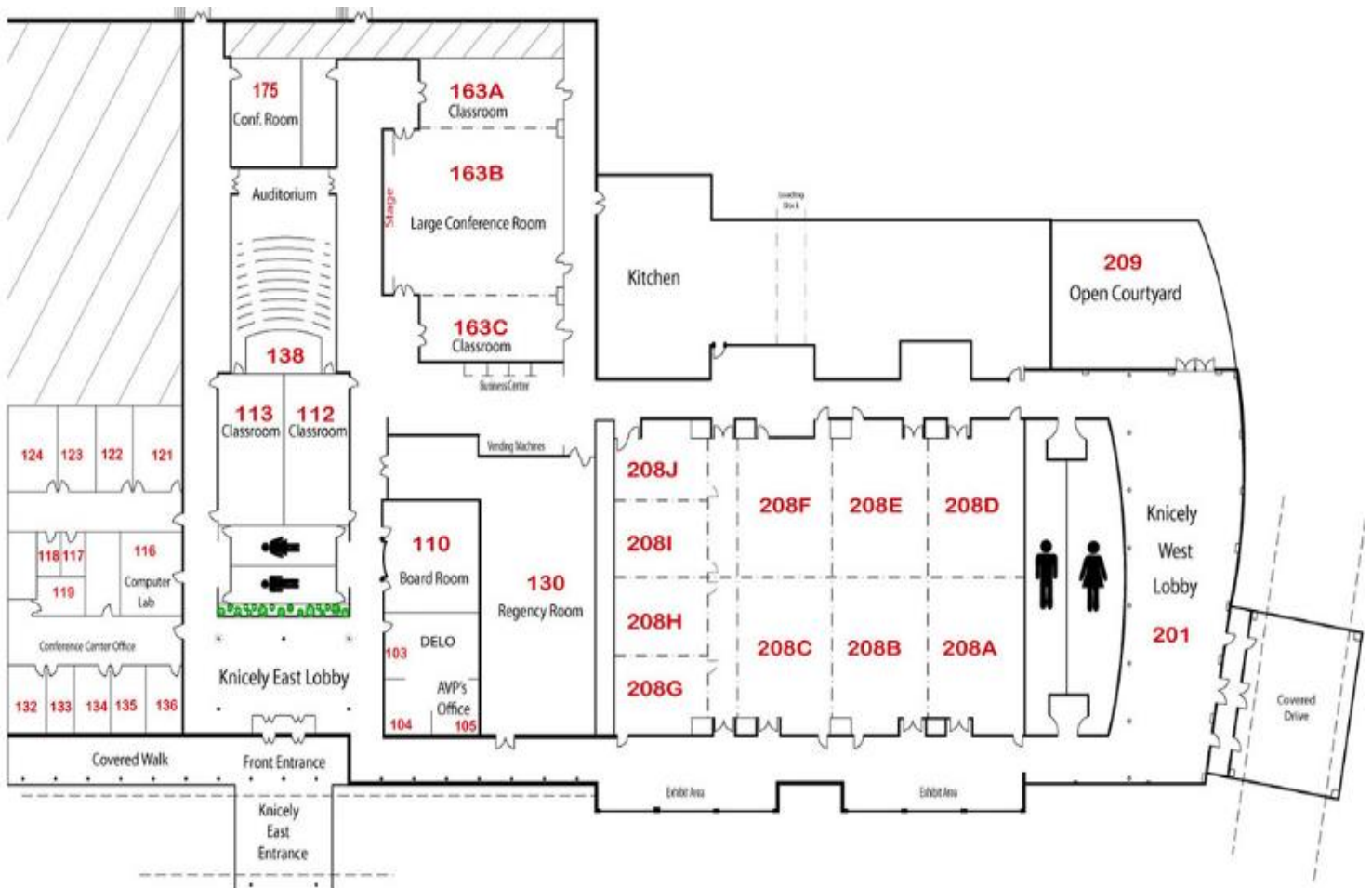
